

Program Release Notes 2.1.3.6

On 1 June 2021 MilitaryChildCare.com (MCC) was upgraded to include several enhancements. The enhancements are summarized in the table below and additional details are provided in subsequent sections.

Enhancement	Details
APT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Anticipated Placement Time (APT) has been redesigned to inform supplanting decisions. This new installation-based APT considers the total system of care at the installation to ensure that lower priority families are not supplanted from care unnecessarily if there is available care at the installation that can meet the needs of the higher priority family. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Note: Families do not currently see APT in the system, but they will see program-based APT in a future version. ▪ Installation level Air Force, Army, and USMC program users with appropriate permissions have access to two new APT related reports. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Applied APT report: Includes children at the installation who have an immediate or unmet need for full-day, full-day Strong Beginnings, or 24/7 care, their age group and family priority, and the APT range for each child. In-Home Care Pilot Program	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ MCC has been updated to include the In-Home Care Fee Assistance Pilot program. 24/7 Care Demand List	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ To comply with a National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) requirement to report demand for 24/7 and extended care at military installations where these non-traditional mission-related services are not currently offered, MCC has been updated to capture families' interest in 24/7 and extended care during the search for care process. ▪ Families will search for care as they do today, but if 24/7 or extended care is not available in the search area, an option will display for the family to express interest in the type of care needed.

In-Home Child Care Fee Assistance Pilot

Enhancements were made to MCC to support eligible families located at select metro zone installations to search for and request fee assistance for full-time, in-home child care services. While these enhancements may not directly impact the actions you take in MCC, it is important to be aware of these changes because families may contact you with questions.

Families meeting the eligibility criteria will see the In-Home Child Care Pilot program profile on their search results, after military operated programs and any MCCYN program options.

24/7 Care Demand List

To comply with an NDAA requirement to report demand for 24/7 and extended care at military installations where these non-traditional mission-related services are not currently offered, MCC has been updated to capture families' interest in 24/7 and extended care during the search for care process.

Families will search for care as they do today, but if 24/7 or extended care is not available in the search area, an option will display for the family to express interest in the type of care needed.
